<u>Summary of responsibilities:</u> The primary function will be to collect qualitative data by conducting key informant interviews and holding focus group discussions with recipients of HIV service users, community members, and other stakeholders. Reinforcing treatment education, collect quantitative data from health facilities in accordance with set Standard Operating Procedures and will be reporting directly to the Regional Community Liaison officers.
