<u>Summary of responsibilities:</u> Main functions will be to support the data collectors in carrying out their activities, interacting and sensitizing HIV service users on the CLM approach; serving as a link between the health facility, community and SFH's regional Team Lead. Will be responsible to enforce confidentiality, maintaining data quality and integrity through other monitoring initiatives, including collaborating with MoHSS data clerks in the region.
