<u>Summary of Responsibilities:</u> The incumbent will provide oversight for Otjozondjupa, Khomas, and Omaheke regions she/he will be based centrally in Khomas. She/he will be responsible to supervise the activities of the Regional Community Liaison Officers and data collectors and providing them with technical and logistical support. She/he will also be the focal point with the District Management Teams of MoHSS and other stakeholders.

Minimum Requirements (Skills, abilities and qualifications): Grade 12 certificate with Diploma in a health-related field or an equivalent qualification. Being fluent (written and spoken) in English and one local language* A track record of progressive experience in working in the HIV field with in particular in-depth knowledge of HIV prevention, treatment and related policies will be an added advantage* A good knowledge of health service delivery system in the region. Proficient and experienced in planning, monitoring and reporting of project activities in multi-stakeholder partnerships and collaborations* Sensitive and responsive to gender, ethnicity, disability and other social issues and other core values of the project partners* Strong organizational, multi-tasking and management skills* Excellent interpersonal, networking, communication, negotiation and facilitation skills* Trustworthy, and demonstrated ability to be a team player* A good knowledge of the social, cultural, political, and economic background in Namibia. Be Namibian or permanent resident.
